	Belmont Research Station, managed by CQUniversity and AgForce, is approximately 30 minutes outside of Rockhampton, located on the Fitzroy River. This tour provides participants with an opportunity to get a first-hand look at some of the latest developments in sensor-based research for improving livestock management and productivity in Northern Australia. This tour has a climate adaptation focus, including information on methane mitigation through targeted nutritional supplements, strategic tree planting to minimise heat stress, and pasture management practices.

Bindaree is also a carbon neutral farming property.
